"A large crowd followed and pressed around him. And a woman was there who had been subject to bleeding for twelve years. She had suffered a great deal under the care of many doctors...yet...she grew worse. When she heard about Jesus, she came up...and touched his cloak, because she thought, "If I just touch his clothes, I will be healed." ~ Mark 5:24b - 28

His peace is contagious. Whatever chaos and frenetic clutter disturbs the balance beneath his feet, Jesus begins by settling the energy in the air around him. The simplicity of his presence is healing. It's restorative. Peaceful.

Mark uses the aggressive language of a clamoring mosh pit to describe the great crowd pressing in on Jesus: People pushed and shoved in every direction, unable to find any sense of balance amidst the noise. So when Jesus paused to wonder aloud who grazed his overcoat, his disciples must have imagined him insane. To them, there was only noise. To Jesus, only fading distraction muffled by his calm, unwavering focus on his beloved Poor. His beloved Forgotten. Powerless. Voiceless.

"Daughter, your faith has healed you," he whispers. "Go in peace."

"Lord, make me an instrument of your peace;" the great inclusive prayer of St. Francis. "Where there is hatred-and in this world, there is much hatred—let me sow love. Where there is despair—and there is much of that as well—let me sow hope. O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled, but to console." Such the prayer of contagious peace echoing from within one indwelled by the Prince of Peace.

And so we begin this Year of Mission with an abiding prayer that we, too, may be Ambassadors of Christ's peace to a people—to all people—pushed and shoved in every direction; unable to find any sense of balance amidst the clamoring noise, both within and without. A prayerful contagion echoing from within all of us indwelled by the Prince of Peace.

May we shine as we have been enlightened. Know as we are known; understand as we have been understood. May we love as we are loved. Always-Light and Peace,

ALERT FOR THOSE OVER 70

Your IRA's 2019 Required Minimum Distribution May Be a Great Way to Give To Trinity

The federal government passed the charitable giving provision called the "IRA Rollover. This allows folks over 70 to "roll over" all or part of their required minimum distribution (RMD) from their IRA directly to Trinity Lutheran Church, and/or other qualified charities.

Why do this? Individuals benefit by satisfying their RMD but do not incur the income tax associated with it, because the gift is going directly to a charity, not to you.

You may withdraw more than your RMD as long as

the total tax benefit is under \$100,000.

Anyone interested in directing their 2019 RMD to Trinity or other charity should request that their fund's administrator make such a roll over in 2019.

Often there is paperwork required to authorize such a transfer. It's not complicated; several of us here at Trinity are currently doing this.
