School Renovation— status update. A loan with LCEF has been approved and the loan will executed as soon as some final paperwork is completed. A Steward Account, at LCEF, has been set up to hold monies pledged to the project, which will ensure funds earmarked for the project are not comingled with the church's general funds.
