# Children's Message

Epistle 1 John 4:7-21

<sup>7</sup> Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. 8 Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. 9 This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. <sup>10</sup> This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. 11 Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. 12 No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us. <sup>13</sup> This is how we know that we live in him and he in us: He has given us of his Spirit. <sup>14</sup> And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world. <sup>15</sup> If anyone acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God, God lives in them and they in God. <sup>16</sup> And so we know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love. 



School Renovation—status update. A loan with LCEF has been approved and the loan will executed as soon as some final paperwork is completed. This paperwork includes, but is not limited to, an appraisal, a Builder's Risk insurance policy, and finalization of the General Contractor contract. These final steps should be completed in April. A Steward Account, at LCEF, has been set up to hold monies pledged to the project, which will ensure funds earmarked for the project are not comingled with the church's general funds.
